study on the Danny Hicks Farm. This study has been highly sought after and has created lots of interest from Randall County Producers. We have been pushing lot's of updates through social media showcasing the study and results that are in progress. This photo highlights the incredible control of grassy weeds.

We invite everyone to attend the *Sorghum IGROWTH Turn Row Mtg.* where we will be showcasing this study on *Friday September 3rd at 10:00am.* Field Directions: 2.5 miles West of Canyon on Hwy 60 Exit FM 1062, then go approximately 6 miles and turn north on Bushland Rd. Then go 1 mile, the field is located on the west side. One CEU in the Drift Minimization category will be provided.

Current Crop Conditions

Overview: Rainfall has been excellent this growing season many have shared that that have never seen this country in such good shape. So far for 2021, according to the National Weather Service we have received a total of 12.74 inches of moisture. The most beneficial part to the rains is the ideal timing as when we received the showers. This certainly plays a big role in the yield of any crop.

Corn/Silage: Have responded well to the moisture along with the cool temperature episodes we've had. Both corn and silage has maintained rapid growth with less heat stress.

Cotton: Although looking good, it is behind about 2 weeks in terms of it's maturity. There simply was not enough heat on the crop early on. In many cases we will need all the productive September we can get.

Sorghum: Looks incredible, however producers really need to be aware of the Sugar Cane Aphid as they have been found in scattered fields throughout Randall County. Producers are encouraged to scout fields at least twice a week as populations can explode rapidly.

<u>Wheat:</u> Yields were a mixed bag this harvest season. Some irrigated fields reaching the 70 bushel range with dryland holding steady at around 20-30 bushels.

Range/Pasture: Not sure that we've ever seen our native pastures look this good. I told someone the other day, you better that a picture cause you probably will never see them look this good ever again.

Critical Time to Keep up with Crop Water Demand

- **1.** Keep up with crop water demands
- **2.** Need to be wrapping up all fertilizing
- **3.** Keep close watch on green stink bugs, aphids,
 Cotton bollworms over next month

4. Maintain a good square set going into flowering on late cotton and maintain a good boll set with limited damage and losses.

Scout Now for Sugar Cane Aphids In Sorghum

We need to make sure weekly scouting for sugar cane aphid is conducted now in sorghum fields, The pre-boot stage is critical as it usually becomes first to when aphids become present. The key to keeping the SCA under control is early scouting and applications treatment when warranted. As a reminder, the following economic



threshold is suggested by Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service .

Threshold for Sugar Cane Aphid

- -20 percent of plants have aphids in the pre-boot stage
- **-20 percent** of plants have more than 50 aphids in the boot stage
- **-30 percent** infestation in the flowering-milk stage
- -30 percent infested with localized areas of heavy honeydew and established colonies in soft dough stages


